Stephen A. Cozen Professor of Law, University of Pennsylvania
“Prospects for the Rule of Law in China”

After three decades of economic reform, China has become an economic power. Many people in the world are wondering whether China will embark on legal reform which matches her impressive economic development. In a presentation scheduled for 14 December 2009, Prof. Jacques deLisle, Stephen A. Cozen Professor of Law, University of Pennsylvania, will speak on prospects for the rule of law in China. The presentation is part of the Speaker Luncheon Series organized by Savantas Policy Institute.

Prof. deLisle is an expert on Chinese law and politics. His research areas include relationships between legal and political change in China, law and economic reform in China, China’s approach to international law, Taiwan’s relations with Mainland China, and Hong Kong’s transition to and development under Chinese rule.

Prof. deLisle holds a Jurist Doctor degree from Harvard Law School and a Ph.D. degree from Harvard Department of Government. Apart from being Professor of Law in University of Pennsylvania, he is also Director of Asia Program at the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a member of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations. He serves frequently as an expert witness on issues of China’s law and government policies and is a consultant, lecturer and advisor to legal reform, development and education programs, primarily in China.
