Penn News

Ronald Daniels has been named the 28th **Provost** of the University of Pennsylvania by President Gutmann. Dr. Daniels is Dean of the Faculty of Law and the James M. Tory Professor of Law at the University of Toronto. He is the second non-U.S. citizen to be Penn's provost. The first was William Smith of Scotland, the University's first provost, appointed by Benjamin Franklin in 1754.

The Department of Defense has given Penn \$5 million to develop large-scale "swarms" of robots that could work together to thoroughly search large areas from the ground and sky for tasks such as finding a bomb in a crowded city.
